

# CAUGHT IN A VICIOUS CIRCLE

The manpower crunch at various police stations in Mumbai has led to long duty-hours, leaving many officials reeling under depression and hyper-tension. Their family life also gets affected, as many of them often have to cancel their leaves during festivals or special bandobast whenever any VVIP comes visiting.

Weeks ago, wives of policemen demonstrated for better working conditions including fixed duty hours for their husbands. They have also been demanding social, economical and physical welfare for their husbands, who are victims of a staff crunch in Mumbai police.

The condition of police personnel deployed at Azad Maidan and Marine Drive is such that they hardly get time to sleep or spend with their family members.

One of the police officials deployed at Azad Maidan said he is very much depressed due to long working hours during bandobast. "I hardly get time to sleep. Even I can't

spend time with my family as most of the time I am under-slept," said the official, who did not wish to be named.

Policemen of various police stations complain that their seniors do not know how to talk to the junior staff members. "They often shout at us over petty issues. They should also think that we have been clocking work hours to 15 hours. And sometimes it goes to 24 hours," said

a PI rank official of Mumbai Police on the condition of anonymity.

The case of policemen committing suicide or attack on their seniors are going up every year.

In a bid to know how many police personnel/officers committed suicide or died on/off duty, an RTI activist Chetan Kothari recently filed an application.

In 2013, a total of 142 police

personnel died (on/off duty) out of which 5 had committed suicide. And in 2014, the number went slightly up. A total of 149 police officials died out of which 6 had eliminated themselves.

However, 164 people died last year and seven of them committed suicide.

There is major discontent among officials over work hours that has literally plagued Mumbai police despite their officials undergoing psycho-analysis tests last year.

But despite being given medical attention, this year at least 63 deaths of serving policemen have been reported till date and most of them were suffering from severe diseases like hypertension.

Now, the long working hours of Mumbai police personnel may be slashed to 8 hours, as the senior officials have launched a pilot project

at Deonar police station, whose officials have reported health issues in bulk.

Mumbai police commissioner DD Padsalgikar said that he is making all efforts to cut short the long working hours of officials, who have been reeling under the burden of extended duty hours.

Deonar police station is the experimental police station where the pilot project has been started, said Padsalgikar. The police chief expects that the experimental work will be over by end of next month.

"We will review the experiment once it is over," said the police chief, adding that he would expand the process to implement in other police stations if it is successful in Deonar.

The working hours of officials deployed at major police stations including Azad Maidan and Marine Drive generally go up to 14 and 15 hours during police bandobast. But the senior officials are also working on such police stations to truncate their duty hours to 8 hours.

## Athawale seeks cabinet berths at Centre, State

Republican Party of India (A) leader Ramdas Athawale, who is a Rajya Sabha member from the BJP quota, has once again raised demand for fare share in the power, with his party getting a cabinet berth each in the central as well as the state cabinet.

"The RPI's role was essential in helping the BJP grab the power at the centre as well as the state. Hence, the party should get the fare share in the power. According to the understanding between the two parties before the election, the RPI needs to get at least 5 per cent share of the power," Athawale said at Jalna in Maharashtra on Sunday.

The 5 per cent share turns out to be one cabinet berth each at the centre and the state cabinet and 4 chairmanships of the state-owned corporations in Maharashtra, he pointed out.

Athawale, who had been touring the drought-hit area, said at a press conference

that his party has demanded an additional Rs 5,000 crore for drought relief from the centre. "I shall soon be meeting Prime Minister Narendra Modi to push for the demand," he added.

Reacting to the current spat between the BJP and the Shiv Sena, Athawale opined that keeping in view the elections of municipal corporations, both the parties need to sort their differences. "I shall soon speak

to both the parties. I'm planning to meet Shiv Sena chief Uddhav Thackeray to propose that the Shiv Sena - BJP - RPI (A) should contest the BMC elections as a united front," he said.

Athawale also spoke of unity among various factions of the Republican party. "All the factions of the party need to come together in the 125th birth anniversary of Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar for the betterment of the society. I'm planning to organise a joint meeting of editors, thinkers, journalists, literary activists etc to ponder over and suggest an action plan in this direction," he said.



## Theft cases on rise in Bhandup

The series of house-breaking cases in Kokan Nagar and Tembipada of Bhandup area have left people in shock as nine different houses were targeted during pre-dawn of Sunday. The four burglars have targeted seven houses in a chawl of Kokan Nagar and de-camped with a laptop. All the houses are single room structures. Also, the house-wreckers broke open the lock and doors of two houses in Tembipada and made off with 7 gram gold jewellery worth Rs. 10,000. Bhandup police are sizing up the CCTV footage installed in the areas. "All the four burglars are young blood between the age group of 24-25 years and their activities are captured in CCTV footage," said senior PI of Bhandup police station, Sripat Kale, who added that the hunt to nab the accused is underway.

## Arrest Khadse's OSD in bribery case: NCP

After Gajanan Patil, who posed as Personal Assistant (PA) of revenue minister Ek-nath Khadse and demanded bribe of Rs 30 crore, was sent to police custody, the NCP has demanded arrested of Unmesh Mahajan, another close aid of the minister.

"The complaint lodged by Dr Ramesh Jadhav eight months back in the case mentions Unmesh Mahajan also and hence the officer on special duty (OSD) in the minister's office needs to be arrested," Nawab Malik spokesperson for the state NCP has said.

"Dr Jadhav, in his complaint, says that when he had a meeting regarding his pending issues with the revenue department, Unmesh Mahajan, who is an OSD in the minister's office, introduced him (Dr Jadhav) to Gajanan Patil. He met Gajanan Patil several times during the eight months. Several of their meetings took place at the Ramtek bungalow, which is the official residence of the revenue minister. The ACB possesses recordings of the

conversations during all these meetings," Malik said.

The revenue minister, in a statement released on late Friday night, had claimed that he knows Gajanan Patil as the person from his own constituency, but Patil was never his PA. The minister also claimed that he had urged the police to pursue any such cases where people are found demanding money in his name and has instructed them to act tough against them all.

However, Malik pointed out that the ACB did not act in the case for eight long months and Patil was arrested only after the matter was heard before Lokayukta and his arrest became inevitable.

Malik demanded that the ACB needs to immediately arrest Unmesh Mahajan and seize hard disks from all the computers from the minister's office.

"NCP demands that each and every person whose name appears in the recorded conversations with Dr Jadhav needs to be booked under the section 123B and a stern action needs to be taken against them," Malik said.

## Crackdown on dumping mafia in Mira Road

In an effort to put brakes on illegal dumping of construction debris in the Mira Bhayandar region, officials attached to Thane district's revenue department have launched a crackdown against offenders.

A vigilance squad led by revenue officer Amol Singh Bhosale took action against 15 trucks which were found illegally dumping construction debris in various parts of the twin-city. While one vehicle was impounded and handed over to the local po-

lice station, the officials imposed and recovered fines totalling Rs 3.81 lakh from the offenders.

## Stuck in limbo for 4 yrs, MBMC plans revival of biodiversity park

Biology books will soon come to life for kids as the Mira Bhayandar Municipal Corporation (MBMC) has decided to revive its proposal to build a bio-diversity park in Uttan near Bhayandar.

The project has been stalled for 4 years. A government-owned plot spread over 31-hectares had been identified for the purpose near Keshav-Srushti in Uttan. While 6 out of the proposed 31 hectares has been handed over to the MBMC, a proposal to acquire the remaining land has been

tabled before the district collectorate. Since then the project is yet to see the light of the day.

As per the revival plan, the MBMC plans to rope in the tourism department and the MMRDA which is the planning authority to develop infrastructure in the Gori-Manori-Uttan belt. Apart from botanical, butterfly, cactus, rock, bamboo, ficus and theme gardens, the project also envisages an amphitheater with audio-visual facilities, nature interpretation center, nature trails, mangrove board walks, bird viewing gallery, exhibition hall and an exclusive play zone for

kids.

Apart from this, solar lighting gadgets would be used to illuminate the premises and a rain water harvesting project will be installed as a part of MBMC's "Save Water" campaign.

"Our sole intention is to maintain the ecological balance ensuring a sustainable environment. Besides being a visual treat for visitors, the park will educate them about the need for conserving biodiversity," said an official. Grasslands will also be developed to protect the zone, having hilltops and characteristic slopes similar to a natural forest valley.

# A ray of hope for amputees

**KEM hospital is awaiting approval for starting the hand transplantation program**

KEM Hospital is awaiting approval for starting the hand transplantation program wherein the surgery and transplantation will be conducted at minimal charges but the expenses of the immuno-suppressants might hit the recipients as these drugs which are to be consumed for life-long can turn out to be expensive for poor economic background family. In wake of this, senior official from the department of plastic surgery has stated that the discussions for extending financial help to the recipient families is underway in order to ensure that the recipients do not suffer the loss.

Unlike any other transplantation, hand transplantation is also similar to kidney and liver transplantation wherein the recipients will have to be on immuno-suppressant drugs for life-time. "Other transplantations are life-saving procedures but hand transplantation is conducted to improve the quality of life of amputees because such kind of people feel that there is no life and hope left for them. Therefore, hand transplantation will make them feel more confident and independent to make their own

living," said Dr Vinita Puri, professor and head of plastic surgery department. The ideal candidates for hand transplantations are traumatic amputees who have lost their limbs in accident or through injury "As such people will have a cut

recipients continue with the immunosuppressant drugs in order to ensure that there is no rejection," added Dr Puri.

The department states that amputees who have desire of getting hand transplantation should get themselves registered with their operation department. Following this, the department will be preparing a list wherein they will be registering people for transplantation and will be evaluating whether the amputee is fit enough to undergo a transplant. A team of doctors including plastic sur-

geons, nephrologists, physiologists, psychiatrists, microbiologists and pathologists at KEM Hospital are all set to carry out hand transplantation and are only waiting for an official approval to set the ball rolling.

Dr Puri said, "The recipients should not worry about the charges of surgery or other technical aspects at the hospital as it will be minimal. However, the recipients' family will have to arrange the finances for the life-long immunosuppressant. We are not committing that we will provide the expenses for the immunosuppressant but we will try to do our best for the recipients and our social workers will look into the matter and extend all the help that can be provided."
